CALL TO ORDER:

Chairman Edward Latuska called the Regular Meeting, of the Center Township Board of Supervisors, to order at 6:32 p.m. The meeting was held at the Unionville Volunteer Fire Company Firehall, 102 Mahood Road, Butler PA 16001.

ROLL CALL:

In addition to Chairman Latuska, present were Vice Chairman Alan Smallwood; Supervisors Ronald Flatt, Kenneth Frenchak and Philip Wulff; Township Solicitor Michael Gallagher; Township Engineer Olsen; and Township Secretary/Treasurer Anthony Amendolea.

PUBLIC TO BE HEARD:

- 1. Latuska, on behalf of himself and Wulff, he thanked the residents for the vote of confidence. He Thanked the other Board members for their support and former supervisor Schiebel and his wife for their support. Although the Board does not always agree, they set their differences aside for the common cause of Center Township and the residents.
- 2. Mr. Nathan Wulff, 5168 McCandless Road: Mr. Wulff presented the Unionville Volunteer Fire Company report for September 2017 as follows:

He reported Center Township has an ISO rating of 5. This is the rating used by insurance companies. He is researching the possibility of having an earned income tax exemption for firefighters.

- 4. Mr. Phillip Mennor, 112 Elise Drive: Mr. Mennor stated the stormwater retention pond behind Rite Aid is holding water. He has contacted the Butler County Conservation

District.

- 3. Regular Meeting October 11, 2017: Latuska motioned approving, New Business, Item 6 which reads "placement of an as in the Butler Eagle" to read "placement of an ad in the Butler Eagle", the minutes of the Regular Meeting held on Wednesday, October 11, 2017. Flatt seconded. Motion carried.

- 1. October 2017: Latuska motioned approving the October 2017 Treasurer's Report. Flatt seconded. Motion carried.
- 2. Warrant List 17-10-20: Latuska motioned approving Warrant List 17-10-20. Frenchak seconded. Motion carried.
- 3. Warrant List 17-11-21: Latuska motioned approving Warrant List 17-11-21. Frenchak seconded. Motion carried.
- 4. Authorize Ad for 2018 Proposed Budget: The Board of Supervisors reviewed the 2018 proposed budget at their workshop meeting held on Tuesday, October 10, 2017 and Monday, November 6, 2017. The 2018 budget reflects a balanced budget of \$1,937,560 in revenues and expenditures, with no tax increase. The Board will consider adopting the budget at their regular meeting scheduled for Wednesday, December 13, 2017 at 6:30 p.m. The budget will be available for public review at the Township office or the website. Latuska motioned authorizing the advertisement of the 2018 Proposed Budget in the Butler Eagle edition on Wednesday, November 22, 2017. Flatt seconded. Motion carried.

ZONING REPORT: October 2017: Construction costs were \$81,005.00 fees collected were \$809.42.

SUBDIVISION & LAND DEVELOPMENTS: None

OLD BUSINESS:

- 1. Aubrey Rezone Ordinance No. 2017-11-04: The Board of Supervisors held a public hearing on Monday, November 6, 2017. The purpose of the public hearing was to inform and obtain public comment and/or testimony on George Aubrey First Family Limited Partnership's request to amend the Center Township Zoning Map by rezoning the following tracts of land from R-1A (Low Density Residential District) to R-2 (Multi-Family Residential District):
 - all that certain property located south of North Duffy Road (Γ-509) and west of Peters Lane, being Center Township Parcel 060-2F104-13E (26.79 acres m/l)
 - all that certain property located south of North Duffy Road (T-509), being Center Township Parcel 060-2F104-13EA (1.88 acres m/l)
 - all that certain property located south of North Duffy Road (T-509), being Center Township Parcel 060-2F104-13EB (2.16 acres m/l)

 all that certain property located south of North Duffy Road (T-509, being Center Township Parcel 060-2F104-13EC (4.02 acre m/l)

The notice of the public hearing was published in the Butler Eagle editions of Sunday, October 22, 2017 and Sunday, October 29, 2017.

Latuska motioned to adopt the Aubrey Rezone Ordinance No. 2017-11-04. Smallwood seconded. The Board was polled:

Wulff	Nay	Aubrey has property available for development before developing the property requested to be rezoned.
Flatt	Nay	Rezoning would create a peninsula within the R-1A zone. Could be considered spot zoning and Aubrey could develop less than capacity.

Motion failed 1 to 3.

2. North Duffy Road Extension Design and Permitting Proposal: Mr. Michael J. Haberman, The Gateway Engineers, presented the traffic study for the North Duffy Road Extension to the Board of Supervisors on Monday, November 6, 2017.

"The proposed Connector road between Lions Road (T-694) and Duffy Road (T-509) would likely impact the traffic patterns in and around the New Castle Road (SR 0356) corridor. Specifically, under the scenario where the connector road would be constructed without the development of the adjacent land, the new road would provide an alternate route for motorists currently traveling through the study area. The redistributed traffic would have little impact to many of the intersections and would actually provide benefits to operations along New Castle Road (SR 0356). The reason for this effect is that some existing traffic would be redistributed away from that corridor by use of the connector roadway. Acceptable overall operations would be expected with little or no need for additional infrastructure or traffic improvements.

On the contrary, the potential development of the land adjacent to the connector road would present larger issues throughout the study area. The trips—associated with the development of office and/or medical office on the land adjacent to the connector road would negate the marginal benefits to the New Castle Road (SR 0356)corridor obtained from constructing the connector road. Under this scenario, the existing infrastructure throughout the study area would ultimately need significant improvements. Based on the analyses, it becomes clear that in addition to the construction of the connector road, direct access to/from U.S. Route 422 will be necessary. Without the direct connection to U.S. Route 422, the existing infrastructure along North Duffy Road, Lions Road, Castle Road (west of Moraine Pointe Plaza) would be inadequate to accommodate the additional traffic associated with the development of the land adjacent to the connector road.

In conclusion and based on the results of the analyses contained within this report, the connector road can be constructed without any major impacts to the surrounding roadway network; however, if land adjacent to the connector road were to develop to its full potential, the surrounding roadway network will not be able to accommodate the additional traffic demands. At some level of development, a connection to and upgrades to the U.S. Route 422 interchange with Castle Road (SR 0356) will be necessary for traffic operations.

If the Township pursues the design and construction of the connector road, it is recommended that the Township also coordinate with other government agencies (PennDot, SPC, etc) to advance a project for the reconstruction of the U.S. Route 422 interchange with New Castle Road (SR 0356) and a direct connection between that interchange and new connector road."

Frenchak motioned authorizing Latuska to sign the North Duffy Road Extension Design and Permitting proposal. Latuska seconded. Motion carried.

3. Comprehensive Plan Review Consultant: Mr. Richard Grossman proposes to review the Comprehensive Plan at a rate of \$85.00 per hour to attend meetings, update analysis and research and create the Comprehensive Plan Document. He projects the project will take approximately eighteen (18) to twenty-two (22) months. Latuska motioned to retain Mr. Richard Grossman as the consultant for the Comprehensive Plan review at a rate of \$85.00 per hour not to exceed \$35,930. Frenchak seconded. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Award Contract for Asbestos Abatement for 707 Oneida Valley Road: The Township is purchasing 707 Oneida Valley Road with Federal Emergency Management Agency funds due to repetitive loss from flooding. The following bid was received for asbestos abatement:

- 3. Leicht and Associates Engagement Letter: Mr. William D. Leicht, Leicht and Associates, submitted an engagement letter to perform the 2017 Audit in the amount of \$20,000. Latuska motioned authorizing himself to sign the Leicht and Associates engagement letter. Frenchak seconded. Motion carried.
- 4. Adopt CPA Appointment Resolution No. 2017-11-17: William D. Leicht and Associates submitted an engagement letter to conduct the 2017 Audit in the amount of \$20,000, which the Board agreed with. Latuska motioned adopting the CPA Appointment Resolution No. 2017-11-17. Flatt seconded. Motion carried.
- 5. Ratify Additional Debt Payment for Maintenance Facility: The required principal payment for 2017 is \$112,000.00 and interest is \$6,008.34 per loan agreement. Township Secretary/Treasurer Amendolea prepared a payment of \$188,008.34 which included \$112,000.00 with an additional \$75,000.00 on the principal and \$6,008.34 interest. Latuska motioned ratifying the additional principal payment of \$75,000.00. Wulff seconded. Motion carried.

Flatt seconded. Motion carried.

PUBLIC WORKS:

- 1. Lions Road (T-694) Guiderail: Step Up Foreman Brewster stated the gas company would place a three (3) to one (1) slope per PennDot specifications which negates using a guiderail. Latuska motioned authorizing Township Solicitor Gallagher draft a letter for Latuska's signature requesting a guide rail be placed along Lions Road (T-694). Frenchak seconded. Motion carried.

However, Randy Brown also attended but the his registration fee was not paid. Latuska motioned authorizing the payment of the \$10.00 registration fee for Randy Brown's attendance at the Butler County Safety Seminar held on Wednesday, October 11, 2017. Smallwood seconded. Motion carried.
- 6. Traffic Signal Maintenance: The traffic signal at McDonalds Restaurant and Clearview Mall entrance has malfunctioned. Traffic Systems and Services stated the controller and batteries need replaced. The cost is estimated at \$5,124.07. Step Up Foreman Brewster recommends checking the signals to see if batteries need replaced. Latuska motioned authorizing replacement of the controller and batteries at the McDonalds Restaurant and Clearview Mall entrance in the amount of \$5,124.07. Smallwood seconded. Motion carried.

Flatt motioned authorizing Step Up Foreman Brewster to replace batteries in the other traffic signals with approval of two (2) supervisors to be ratified at December's meeting scheduled for Wednesday, December 13, 2018. Latuska seconded. Motion carried

- 7. Rental of Boom Mower: Step Up Foreman Brewster was contacted by Oakland Township to rent our boom mower. The cost to rent with a full time employee would be \$90.00. A part time employee the rate is \$60.00. With our operator any and all claims will be filed on our insurance policy. Oakland Township will be responsible for the deductible and traffic control. Latuska motioned authorizing the rental of the boom mower and operator, contingent on responsibility of the deductible and traffic control, at a cost of \$90.00. Smallwood seconded. Motion carried.
- 8. Litter Pickup: Smallwood reported the Boy Scouts will pick up litter on Saturday, November 18, 2017 and Sunday, November 19, 2017.
- 9. Bobcat Excavator: The Bobcat Excavator has a cylinder leaking and two (2) flat spots on the cam shaft.

ENGINEER'S REPORT:

- 1. Lakewood Drive/Hull Lake Repair: Township Engineer Olsen will provide signage requirements for a single lane. Permit to lower Hull Lake will not be issued until Spring 2018 by the Department of Environmental Protection.
- 2. Lions Road (T-694)/Crooked Run Culvert: Township Engineer Olsen filed with the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection of the concerned of concerns (corrected 12/13/2017) that Crooked Run is obstructed. Investigation will be conducted by Butler County Conservation District. Township Engineer Olsen will contact the Butler County Conservation District for status of investigation.
- 3. Margate Court Right-of-Way Release: Township Engineer Olsen stated Mr. Dennis Beblo approved of the plan. He will present to the Planning Commission and the Board of Supervisors.

- 1. Cypher Insurance Claim: Our insurance carrier is willing to settlement the Cypher's claim in the amount of \$32,892.54. Latuska motioned directing the insurance company to settle the Cypher claim in the amount of \$32,892.54. Flatt seconded. Smallwood abstained. Motion carried 4 to 0.
- 2. Pinehurst Road Bridge: Mr. William Sinick, Pennsylvania Utilities Commission, wants to meet with the Township either Tuesday, November 21, 2017 at 11:00 a.m. or Wednesday, November 22, 2017 at 1:00 p.m. at the Township office.

MISCELLANEOUS:

- 1. Bole Stormwater Repair: Mr. Ronald Bole stated that the pipe installed by the Township prevented water from entering his house but water sheet flowing from Mar Vel Drive floods his back yard.
- 2. Duffy Road Extension: Frenchak reported that he has talked to Mr. Mark Gordon, Butler County Planning Commission, 79/80 Corporation, Penn Northwest Development, J. J. Gumberg, Weaver Homes, Howard Hanna and Stephen Gifford, CDC about the Herold property.
- 3. Veterans Administration Stormwater Retention Ponds: Township Solicitor is scheduling a meeting with Mr. David Hargrave.
